UNIT STRUCTURE

The basic organizational unit in DRUM is called the unit structure. It consists of seven officers. The names and functions of the officers are as follows:

Reporter: Person responsible for gathering pertinant information on the continuing train of injustices and abuses in the department.

Chairman & Co-Chairman: Chairs unit meetings and co-ordinates the activities of the unit structure. He is also responsible for strengthening the unit structure in terms of cohesiveness and discipline.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Responsible for collecting dues and keeping financial records.

Membership & Circulation: Parties include distributing literature to the workers and keeping records of recruits.

Educational: Responsible for politicizing, informing and developing programs and methods to deal with the concrete problems the organization faces.

<u>Public Relations</u>: The P.R. man is the official spokesman for the unit structure. His job is mainly to explain to non-members what DRUM is all about and informs others of DRUMs position on issues.

Intelligence & Security: Based on our previous encounters with the police and plant protection we felt a need to set up an office that will handle explosive situations. Since DRUM is not a military organization we try to avoid any unessary confrontation. The functions of Intelligence & Security deals with problems relating to the welfare of the workers such as discipline.

Steering Committee: The steering committee is a boby composed of the chairman and co-chairman of the unit structure. This body serves to co-ordinate plant-wide activity and evaluate the progress and program of the organization.
