MATERIALS AND INFORMATION FOR
USE IN RELATION TO D. R. U. M. PICKETING

Attached are two items:

1. Amended Order to Show Cause directed to General G. Baker, Jr. and D.R.U.M.
2. Preliminary Injunction dated July 16, 1968 prohibiting mass picketing and interference by D.R.U.M. and persons acting in concert with them.

Observe any thing that goes on at the gate and prepare a statement of what you see and hear. Make it specific and note particularly the following things:

Number of pickets - carrying of signs (what do they say)
- any statements by pickets - an accurate count of the number of people - how close pickets are to the gate (number of feet) - any interference with workers going into the gate. Names of pickets, if possible.

If any mass picketing of more than five people around any gate is observed, with information or signs connecting such people to D.R.U.M., serve as many of the leaders as is possible with a copy of the Preliminary Injunction.

(a) Method of Service - attempt to hand injunction to individual and ascertain his name. If he refuses to take the injunction, touch him with it and drop it in front of him.

(b) After serving an individual make a note of the following items:

- (1) how service was accomplished.
- (2) time of day
- (3) exact place
- (4) person making service
- (5) name, if possible, of the person served.

Also observe the activity of the person after service of the injunction -- does he continue to engage in the prohibited activity?

Attached is a Proof of Service to complete on any person that you serve the Injunction upon. Please fill it out completely.

If General G. Baker, Jr. or any person who can be identified with D.R.U.M. is observed at the gates or involved in the picketing, serve them with a copy of the Order to Show Cause in the same manner that you did the Preliminary Injunction.
