

Description as follows: Center Gate: #1 - female, black, 5'3", 110 lbs afro hair style, short black jacket. #2 - female, black, 5'3", 120 lbs., short red jacket. #3 - female, black, 5'3", 120 lbs., green jacket, black and white polka dot scarf on head. All wearing blue denim pants. North Gate: #1 - female, black, 5'8", 120 lbs., afro hair style, dark jacket and pants. #2 - female, white, 5'2", 115 lbs., long dark hair, dark jacket and pants. All are in their early twenties. They refused to give any pamphlets to Plant Protection. No trouble.

At approximately 7:45 PM, November 17, 1975, 2nd shift Superintendent E. Oliver notified a supervisor of Plant Protection that he had information that a non-employee was passing cup literature in department 9310.

A search of the plant was made by Plant Protection and Mr. Oliver but the subject could not be found.

Mr. Oliver notified plant protection that he had received information that the subject was a former employee of Huber Foundry by the name of Arnold Witt. A description was obtained and passed to the patrolman at the main gate. The patrolman advised a truck man left the plant at approximately 8:15 PM who fit the description wearing a green production helmet.

TROUBLE ACTIVITY

At 6:45 A.M. a Black female and a white male were passing out literature at the Eight Mile plant main gate. The male was approximately 6' tall, was wearing a heavy beard and in his late twenties.
