In the last few weeks we the workers at the Chrysler Jefferson plant were told that we would soon have no jobs-the plant was to be closed down. And you, Lynn Townsend, the Chairman of Chrysler's Board, expressed your deep concern for us by going to Hawaii for a 2 week vacation. While you were out in the Pacific Ocean, in the surf and sand, we were out here in the cold, with rising prices and no jobs.

JARUM--Jefferson Assembly Revolutionary Union Movement-is a rank and file organization at Jefferson that is fighting to stop the layoffs and keep Jefferson open.

When Lynn Townsend gets back from lovely Hawaii, Jarum and other concerned workers will be at Chrysler Headquarters to "greet him," and let him know that all is not so lovely here in Detroit. Prices of food and other items are rising and the unemployed number 300,000 here in Detroit--not including the 1,600 workers at Jefferson, 1,800 at Dodge Main, and 620 workers at a Lyons, Michigan Chrysler plant (out of 730 workers!). We are tired of having our jobs snatched away from us while the owners and directors of these companies keep living high on the hog--off of our blood and sweat. JARUM wants all workers and their families, friends, community organizations, block clubs and church groups to come out and show Chrysler that we will not be thrown into the streets. Just as the coal miners have united to fight for a decent contract this year, we must unite, and stop our jobs and the jobs of others from being taken away.
