The Supplement will use photographs recently obtained from the Vietnamese in Paris. These photographs show the effects of some of the most recent bombing raids of the North, the range of anti-personal weapons and their devastation. We will print additional copies of this Supplement for use in agitational efforts against the war this spring. Including the cost of additional color, half-toning photographs and additional copies of the Supplement, the cost will be \$100.00.
2. Recently, MCLL has participated in a major struggle at the Chrysler Gear and Axle Plant, Local 961. The nature of the struggle pits J.U. Sims, a black man fired for his militancy both on racial and union issues against Frank McKinnon, a white man whose politics are completely reactionary (he campaigned for President Johnson) and who has the support of the U.A.W. bureaucracy.

The election was held on January 12, 13, 1972 and J. U. Sims lost by 23 votes. Because of numerous election law violations, the local membership rejected the results of the election and now the Labor Department is investigating the election.

Our involvement included a special distribution of a special edition of Changeover, and the production of over 30,000 leaflets, examples of which are enclosed.

A considerable agitational effort remains to be done. The amount needed for costs already incurred and work in the immediate future is \$150.00.

It is the responsibility of the General Staff to elect additional members to the Central Committee.

IV, #5:

The Central Committee members are voting members of the General Staff ex officio and may, if elected, represent sections as well, although no one may represent more than one section. At least two-thirds of the Central Committee must be functioning members of the General Staff.

IV, #8 (addition):

The ~~three~~ highest vote getters in the Central Committee election are elected for a one year term. The three lowest are elected for a six month term.
