Dear Ron,

Sorry for the delay in responding to you. I have had some difficulties in putting together the Social Policy materials on auto workers, as you might have surmised by now.

What has happened is that some people have not come through with their stuff and this has made the case for a special issue a little difficult to support, and also put too much burden on the pieces I do have to satisfy the editors of the magazine. This has been the case with your piece: some editing would have satisfied them (nothing substantial which is good) but without several other strong pieces we didn't have enough to go with from their perspective.

However, instead of re-editing or further waiting for a couple of people to come through, another possibility has come up. Through the auspices of Brooklyn College, a faltering institution with money to spend that is earmarked for publication, I am requesting support for a publication on the urban crisis and labor. If this works out, we would have an opportunity to discuss papers, get criticism, and then edit for publication. I think this would be a very positive thing, if it could be pulled off. An issue of Social Policy and possibly a book could be produced.

This is a postponement of the original project which I regret, but perhaps the escalation will work out. I'll keep you posted.
