DEMONSTRATION ACTIVITY - Communist Labor Party of the United States of North America Demonstrating at Chrysler Center.

At 3:00 P.M., Thursday, May 1, 1975, twenty-two demonstrators arrived on Oakland Avenue, and proceeded to picket on the sidewalk in front of 137 Building lobby entrance. Some were carrying placards, (see Attachment No. 3 for content), and one male was carrying a sign.

By 4:00 P.M., a total of 93 demonstrators were in the area, including 15 children. Picketing was peaceful, with no unusual incidents. At 4:20 P.M. the pickets departed the area; however two women stationed themselves at the Colorado Gate and were distributing literature as employees were exiting the Complex. After approximately five minutes, they too departed.

Channel Two television news crew arrived at the Main Gate to cover the proceedings.

The Highland Park Police Department was notified, and were in the area during the demonstration.

# STOP BUSING - NOT FASCISM!

The busing of Negro and Anglo-American children to achieve "racial balance" is rapidly becoming the most explosive political issue in our country. In Boston, fascist mobs attacked Negro children on their way to school. This violent attack is the beginning of what we may expect in September in Detroit, Los Angeles, San Francisco, and many other cities where busing is being projected for the next school year. Every fascist and reactionary in the country is lining up against busing.

After years of struggle in the Civil Rights Movement, the ghetto uprisings and resultant federal and state laws against discrimination, court rulings, etc., it would appear that equality of opportunity for a decent education for Negro children would be already achieved. But the facts are just the opposite. Despite superficial gains in politics and employment for mostly middle class Negroes, the truth is that the masses of Negroes suffer more unemployment, worse housing, almost non-existent education and daily "legal" lynchings by the police.



This struggle of the Negro People for busing is part of their struggle for national liberation and equality; it is also the spearhead of the struggle of all the working and oppressed peoples in the U.S. The fascists know this: that is why every rag-tag nazi and bob-tail Klansman in the country is preparing for battle against busing.

Workers Beware! Don't be fooled by the demagogy of the fascists! The struggle of the Negro People is our struggle. If the working class-- Negro, Anglo-American, Latin American -- doesn't unite as one to defeat this attack on the Negro People, there is no possibility of winning the fight for jobs, for peace and for socialism.
